KOUGA WIND FARM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TRUST

The Kouga Windfarm Community Development Trust (KWFCDT) recently adopted a new strategic intent that is premised on the theory of change model. The Trust's intent is based on three pillars (1) improving the quality of education and skills development (2) improving the quality of life and (3) reducing poverty – all this in the four communities of Kruisfontein, KwaNomzamo, Umzamowethu (Oyster Bay) and Sea Vista.

KWFCDT (The Trust) has in turn adopted a new operating model and is now geared to fulfil its vision and mission in a robust and cautiously focussed approach to achieve the desired developmental impact.

Under the Sports, Arts, Recreation and Culture pillar, the Trust seeks to improve social cohesion and inclusivity, and protect the heritage of communities. This will improve our communities' well-being, leading to reduced vulnerability and inequality, and improved safety and security.

The overall impact will be reduced community vulnerability through the provision of basic services, skills and coping mechanisms that will lead to greater self sufficiency.

In its role as a catalyst, the Trust is focussing on issues or systemic problems that stand in the way or prohibits our communities to become thriving, resilient, sustainable and empowered and we will work collaboratively with others to achieve our vision and mission.

Thus the KWFCDT hereby invites Sports Facilities Developers that are involved in **SPORTS, ARTS, RECREATION AND CULTURE** in the four focal communities to submit funding proposals for the refurbishment and repurposing of existing sports courts into **Combi Courts** accommodating **Netball, Tennis and Basketball** in three primary schools as shown below:

MZINGISI PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Refurbish existing court into Combi Court (Tennis, Netball & Basketball)
- Refurbish fencing where required
- Spectator facility

GRASLAAGTE PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Refurbish the existing two courts into Combi Courts (Tennis, Netball & Basketball)
- Refurbish fencing where required
- No spectator facilities required as there already exist

KRUISFONTEIN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Refurbish existing court (in front of school) into Combi Court (Tennis, Netball & Basketball)
- Fence this court
- Build a new combi court (Tennis, Netball & Basketball) next to this court with no fencing
- Dual spectator facility

GUIDELINES ON ACCEPTABLE FUNDABLE PROGRAMMES:

1. Sports, Arts, and Recreation

1.1 Sport

1.1.1 The administration, development, co-ordination or promotion of sport or recreation in which the participants take part on a non-professional basis as a pastime.

1.1.2 The provision of sporting infrastructure, sporting equipment and coaching services.

1.2 Culture

1.2.1 The advancement, promotion or preservation of the arts, culture, or customs.

1.2.2 The promotion, establishment, protection, preservation or maintenance of areas, collections, or buildings of historical or cultural interest, national monuments, national heritage sites, museums, including art galleries, archives, and libraries.

1.2.3 The provision of youth leadership or development programmes

2. Land and Housing (Buildings)

2.1 The development, construction, upgrading, conversion, or procurement of housing units for the benefit of poor and needy persons.

2.2 The development, servicing, upgrading or procurement of stands, or the provision of building materials, for purposes of the activities contemplated in paragraph 1.

2.3 The provision of residential care for retired persons, where more than 90 per cent of the persons to whom the residential care is provided are over the age of 60 and regular meals and nursing services are provided by the organisation carrying on such activity.

2.4 The provision of residential care for disabled persons where regular meals and nursing services are provided by the organisation carrying on such activity.

2.5 Building and equipping of community centres, clinics, sport facilities or crèches of other facilities of a similar nature for the benefit of the poor and needy.

CRITERIA FOR PROPOSAL EVALUATION

(based on the Trust's Projects Procurement Policy):

For Socio-Economic Development (SED) Beneficiary applications, the following information is mandatory to be considered.

8.4.1. Project rationale and background

8.4.2. Implementing organisation founding CIPC documents, constitution, and Trust Deed where applicable; organisation to be within the 50km radius of operation and compliant with the business laws of RSA

8.4.3. Management profile, experience, and competencies

8.4.4. Completed project contactable references.

8.4.5. Statutory compliance

8.4.6. Latest signed financial statement

8.4.7. Related insurances if applicable

8.4.8. Project technical detail including problem statement and solution, beneficiaries, design elements of program with clear KPI, schedule of activities, outcomes, risks, and their mitigation.

8.4.9. Letters of external support for the project. Projects that have multi-partner funding are welcome.

8.4.10. Detailed project budget breakdown with sections to include technical, management, administration, and other costs. *The Trust does not fund an organisation's day to day operational costs e.g., salaries, water, electricity, rent, airtime/data.*

8.4.11. Project cashflow and tranche payment plan

8.4.12. A Competent Person's Report confirming that at least 85% of the benefit received will benefit Black people in the priority community, in accordance with Socio-Economic Development Contributions no. 36928, Department of Trade and Industry Gazette, 11 October 2013.

8.4.13. Project reporting framework

8.4.14. Project impacts - a minimum of 100 people in the communities; community problem resolved; key performance indicators achieved; number of local jobs created; local businesses that have benefitted.
