Over 3,500 Learners Embrace STEM Skills


Thanks to the KWFCDT's Afterschool Programme, science labbased practicals, as well as coding and robotics tutorials, are on-going at Kruisfontein, Graslaagte, St Patrick's, and Sea Vista Primary Schools!

Now, over 3,500 students can explore cool stuff in these 3 Computer Labs, and 6 Science Labs funded by the Trust. 2 local youth were also capacitated as facilitators for the programme.



ECD Nutrition Programme

The Trust supported The Lunchbox Fund to launch an ECD Nutrition Programme. Through the initiative, 24 ECD centres are receiving nutritious meals for their young learners.

Additionally, the programme created 24 jobs through local Food Mamas who are providing additional support to the centres. This means the dedicated principals and teachers can give 100% to teaching and fostering bright young minds.

The programme perfectly aligns with the Trust's Welfare and Humanitarian Development pillar which seeks to create thriving, resilient, empowered, and sustainable communities. In turn leading to reduced poverty and hunger, and increased health and well being.

KwaNomzamo HCBC

A safe and secure medication storage facility valued at over R50k was donated by the Trust to KwaNomzamo Home Community Based Care. This local NPO is now a key pickup point for the Central Chronic Medicines Dispensing and Distribution (CCMDD) programme as it has been pre-approved by the DoE.

The facility will ease the queues at KwaNomzamo Clinic, improving access to chronic medication and enhancing primary healthcare services. 350 patients will benefit from the convenient pickup. 20 beneficiaries are also being supported with nutritional supplements and disposal nappies, and 20 elderly community members were gifted with blankets.

The initiative is a shining example of the Trust's commitment to Welfare and Humanitarian Development. It aligns perfectly with the goal to create thriving, resilient, empowered, and sustainable communities, as they lead to reduced poverty and hunger, and increased health and well-being.

Umzamowethu Retrofit Project

In alignment with the commitment to "Charity Begins at Home," KWFCDT is proudly supporting the growth of 6 local Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) by providing essential construction Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and equipment. This ensures that businesses comply with Health and Safety regulations while equipping them with fundamental construction tools.

Furthermore, the Trust has contracted these six local SMEs to spearhead Phase 1 of the transformative Umzamowethu House Retrofit Project! The project will renovate homes, address critical environmental and living conditions, empower individuals, and restore human dignity where it's needed most; at home.

The recently launched Phase 1 of the project will renovate 12 houses. Phase 2 which will commence in January 2024 will see an additional 87 houses retrofitted, bringing the total to 99!

Wi-Fi Connectivity

The Wi-Fi backbone platform is now in operation and has been handed over by the infrastructure engineers to the newly appointed Operate and Maintain service provider. The Operate and Maintain service provider will ensure the day-to-day operation and maintenance of the Wi-Fi infrastructure, including hardware and software components.

This forms part of the KWFCD's objective to provide free Wi-Fi connectivity for its beneficiary communities, and the expected performance of the network is ranked at 10 Mbps download speed and 4 Mbps upload speed.


Local Networking and Data Gathering


